YOUR TURN

What do you feel passionate about? If you're not sure, consider what you're curious about. Think about your natural talents, hobbies and interests. Perhaps, start by remembering what you loved doing as a kid. Finally, ask others who know you well if there are things they've noticed you're especially good at.

Notice when you enjoy doing something. Jot down some notes as you do these things to see if you can find a few common themes. Then find someone you trust to help you process what you've learned so far. An outside perspective can be extremely helpful when you're trying to find clarity on an issue as personal as this one.

Don't be afraid to call someone with a career you find interesting and ask them how they got started. You will likely find that most people who love what they do also love to talk with others about it!

Finally, remember that people don't just have one passion; there are many areas that we can become passionate about. By trying new things and taking on new opportunities, we can find new interests and passions that we enjoy and want to work toward.
